A.Objective:

The primary objective of the Academic Audit conducted on November 20, 2023, at S.T.S.N. B.Procedure:

1.Departmental Visits by Academic Advisors (10 AM- 4 PM):

- Academic Advisors, Dr.B.Yasodarani and Dr.B.Triveni, visited IQAC and verified the records to be submitted by the Principal, later they visited various departments to assess academic processes and verify records.
- Scrutinized data that is submitted in prescribed proformas to the College Principal for accuracy and completeness.

2.Exit Meeting (4 pm):

- All attendees, including Academic Advisors, the Principal, Vice Principal, IQAC Coordinator, Academic Coordinator, and other staff members attended the exit meeting convened by IQAC for getting honest feedback from the academic advisors and suggestions for future improvement.

3. Brief Report by Academic Advisors:

- Academic Advisors presented a concise report highlighting key findings, strengths, and areas for improvement identified during the audit.
- Shared observations on curriculum relevance, teaching methodologies, assessment practices, and faculty development.

C. Summary of the Event:

The Academic Audit event at S.T.S.N GDC, Kadiri, was conducted with a systematic approach, fostering collaboration among Academic Advisors and key stakeholders. The departmental visits allowed for a firsthand assessment of academic practices, and the exit meeting provided a platform for a comprehensive discussion on the audit process and its outcomes.




